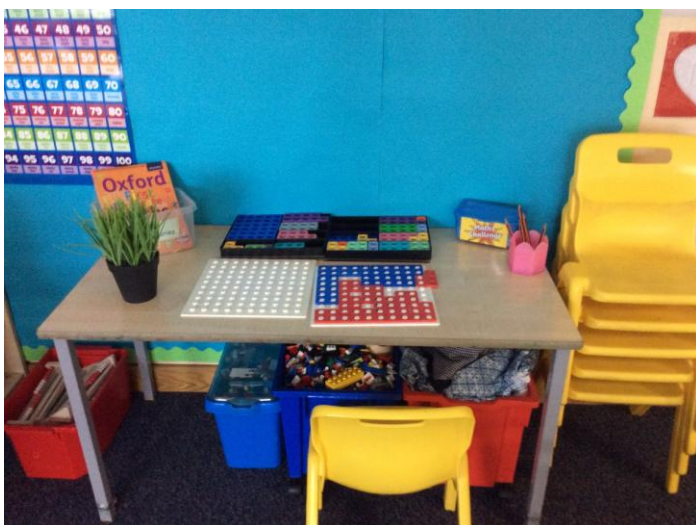

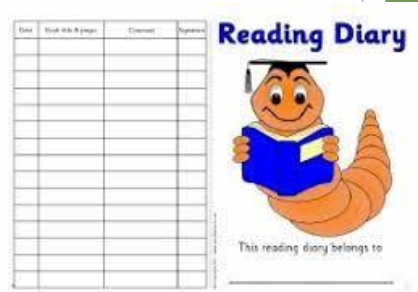

Numbots helps consolidate their basic maths skills.

Homework Reading Expectations



Your child must read at least 3 times a week at home and a grown up must record what they have read in their reading diary. This book is changed once a week and is matched with their phonics ability.

In addition to this, children will also have the opportunity to choose their own reading book matched to their colour level. Children will be able to change this as and when a new book is needed.

There is a reading rocket that your child will move up each week if they have read three times. Lets see who can get to the sun this half term!

Every week a key stage one newsletter is available both on the website and emailed to you. This will keep you informed of what your child has been learning in the week and any other relevant information.

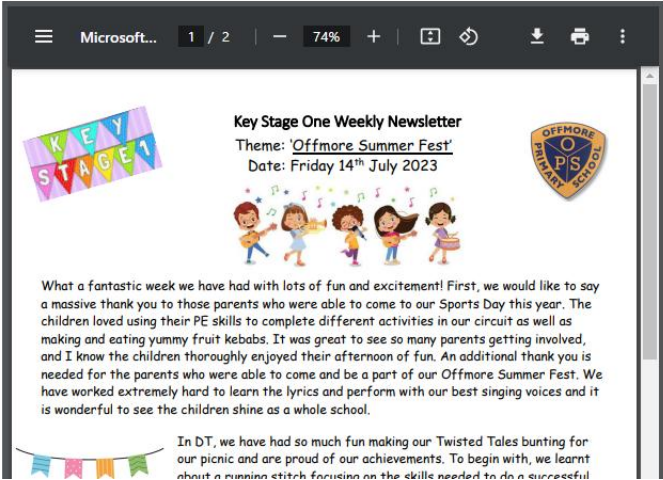
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Key Stage 1 Newsletter
